

FOOD SERVICE MANAGEMENT

The Board believes that good nutrition is essential to students' readiness to learn. The Superintendent/designee is authorized to develop and implement an efficient and effective food service program for M.S.A.D. #29 students.

Foods and beverages provided through the school unit's food service program will meet the nutrition standards established by federal regulations. The food service program will include breakfast and lunch and, if the District participates, the federally supported After School Snack program.

The Board expects the food services program to be self-supporting. The Superintendent will report periodically on the financial status of the District's food services operations.

Changes in prices charged for food and beverages shall require Board approval.

Food services accounts shall be audited as part of the District's annual audit.
